Today is Pentecost, the last day of this year's Easter Season. The liturgical color goes from the celebratory white and red, to the green that will be with us until the end of the year. We won't see the Easter Candle being lit at each Mass and we won't smell as much incense as we have been (that may be good news to some parishioners).

Many of us have developed special devotions and practices for Lent and Easter. It is tempting to drop them once the "High Holidays" are past. This is natural but it should not be done. If you have made it a practice to say the Rosary with your family, have a schedule for Eucharistic Adoration or go to daily Mass, this is not the time to abandon them. I know for a fact that if we continue these practices they will become habits, good habits.

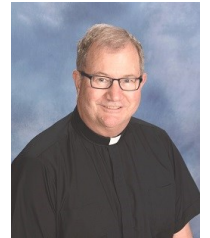
This is also the beginning of summer time; vacation time, time away from home. It should not be a time away from our faith. If we are traveling we still have the duty of attending Sunday Mass. If you are away from home you can look up local Masses on masstimes.org. Their app is called "Mass Times for Travel." All you have to do is put in the zip code of your location and it will pull up all Catholic Churches in the area with Mass times, addresses and the rite. Recently I was traveling and went to a church in Cullman, Alabama (on my way to Destin). The church was beautiful and the people were welcoming, and although it is a Roman Catholic Church there were small differences in the Mass that were interesting to experience. While you are traveling take the opportunity to experience the true Catholicity of our faith.

Summer is also a time for summer reading. I know that when I read during the summer I often read books that are entertainment, and that is OK. There are however many excellent Catholic books, some about the history of the Church, some about all the spiritual aspects of the faith, others about great saints. If that is not your cup of tea, there are novels by Catholic writers.

Currently my wife, Mary Beth, is reading a novel that is part of the Father Elijah series by Michael D. O'Brien, which she is enjoying. I am reading the book, *Silence*, by the Japanese Catholic writer, Shusako Endo. There are also books by Catholic writers such as G.K. Chesterton, J.R.R. Tolkien, Graham Greene, Flannery O'Connor, to name a few. There are plenty of good books out there by Catholic authors.

Faith Sharing Questions

The Most Holy Trinity, Ordinary Time, Cycle A

The day after Pentecost (June 5th this year) we return to "Ordinary Time" as the Liturgical "Season." We will remain in Ordinary Time until Advent, which begins on December 3rd this year. The Liturgical color that characterizes Ordinary Time is green. The first two Sundays after

Pentecost are always two special feasts. The first Sunday after Pentecost is the Feast of the Most Holy Trinity. The second Sunday after Pentecost is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Also, the Friday after the Second Sunday after Pentecost (June 23rd this year) is a Solemnity of the Lord, The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus.

With the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity, we summarize the workings of the Triune God that we have commemorated during Easter Season: The Life, Death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ (Second Person of the Trinity) which redeemed human history... the coming of the Holy Spirit (Third Person of the Trinity) which sanctifies humanity... and the Creation of all that is redeemed and sanctified by the God who holds all in being (The First Person of the Trinity). Our readings on this Sunday give us insights into the nature of God as expressed in the Scriptures. Trinity Sunday was declared a feast for the universal church by Pope John XXII in 1334.

Gospel Reading (John 3:16-18): This reading contains the now familiar John 3:16: "God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but might have eternal life." Very succinctly, John gives the reason for the Incarnation and the Paschal Mystery: God's love for the world and God's longing for the world to share in His eternal life.

First Reading (Exodus 34:4-6,8-9): In this reading we hear about one of Moses' encounters with God on Mount Sinai. The LORD stands with Moses in a cloud and proclaims His name "LORD." Moses is overcome with awe and bows down. Moses then begs the Lord to come along with the company of his people, for as Moses characterizes them, they are "indeed a stiff-necked people."

Second Reading (2 Corinthians 13:11-13): This reading is the conclusion to Paul's Second Letter to the Church at Corinth. After exhorting the people, Paul concludes with the familiar words, "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with

you all." In the Liturgy, this Trinitarian blessing is normally used as a greeting at the beginning of Mass. In this reading, it is a farewell blessing.

Corpus Christi Procession on June 18

June 18th is the Feast of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, (*Corpus Christi*). After the 11:30 Mass, we will have a procession with the Blessed Sacrament from the main church to The Divine Mercy Eucharistic Adoration Chapel in our convent building. Such processions are a joyful part of our parish's local traditions. We look forward to observing the 20th Anniversary of our Divine Mercy Adoration Chapel IN January. That's twenty years of people praying before the Lord in the Most Blessed Sacrament. Please plan to participate in the procession.

so Boniface returned to England. The next year he returned to Europe and went to Rome where Pope Gregory II gave him a new name “Boniface” and appointed him as the missionary bishop of Germania.

In Germany Boniface cut down an oak tree that the Germans worshipped. As he was cutting it a wind came up and blew it down, and as the pagan God did not strike down Boniface, the conversions in Germany began. He baptized thousands of Germans and also formed an alliance with the Carolingians (Charles Martel’s family) that helped in his missionary work by their support. In 754 he returned to Frisia to complete the work that brought him to Europe originally. There he was killed by a group of robbers.

He is celebrated across Germany and honored in England as well. Legend also credits Boniface with beginning the Christmas tree tradition. This information barely scratches the surface about this interesting and important saint. You are encouraged to read more about him online or at your library or local Catholic bookstore.

Saint of the Week

Saint Boniface



On June 5th we celebrate Saint Boniface, the patron saint of Germany, brewers, World Youth Day and Fulda, a town almost exactly in the center of Germany. Yet he was not born in Germany. He was English by birth, born approximately in 675, in Exeter or Crediton, both in Devonshire. His

name originally was Winfrid, Wynfrith or Wynfryth. He studied under the Benedictines, then taught school and at the age of 30 became a priest. When the abbot of his monastery died he was asked to take his place, but Boniface decided instead to go as a missionary to the Frisians, (people who lived on the north coast of Holland and Germany). The Frisians were at war with Charles Martel, the grandfather of Charlemagne,

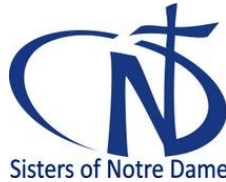

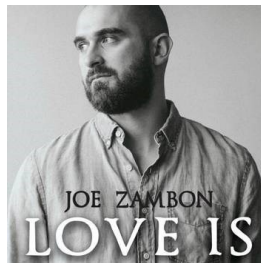
